Oklahoma School Testing Program Overview

ESSA – Goals for States

- 95% participation on assessments
 - Required for Title I funding
- Only 1% may take alternate tests
- States may assess other subjects

ESSA – Goals for States

- Must adopt challenging academic standards
- Math & reading/ELA assessed in grades 3-8 & once in grades 9-12
- Science assessed at least once in grades 3-5, 6-9, and once 10-12

ESSA Peer Review

- Assessment peer review is the process through which a State documents the technical soundness of its assessment system.
- The OSDE Office of Assessments submitted over 8,000 pages of OSTP evidence to the USED in January of 2018 and received a “Substantially Meets” requirements.
- The OSDE Office of Assessments submitted ACT evidence to the USED in December of 2018 and received a USED designation of “Substantially Meets” requirements.
- The OSDE Office of Assessments will submit additional evidence to the USED in December of 2019.

Peer Review Update

- USED designated OSDE's high school ELA/Math assessments as "Substantially Meets Requirements."
- Why does this matter?
 - Title I funds
- What next?

Peer Review: Accommodations

- Evidence that no student with a valid score on the State assessment is denied the equal benefit of other students (i.e., all students with a valid score receive a college-reportable score).
- OSDE must come into compliance and will develop revised guidance for SAT/ACT accommodations.

Peer Review: Informed Consent

- Student participation in the **non-test portion/survey** of the SAT or ACT requires either parental informed consent or age of majority student's consent.
- Districts will be required to obtain informed consent permitting students to participate in the **non-test portion/survey** of the SAT or ACT.
- OSDE will develop procedures to meet this requirement.

Peer Review: CCRA Selection

- Evidence that LEAs notified all parents of high school students it serves:
 - That the LEA intends to request approval from the OSDE to use a nationally recognized high school academic assessment in place of the statewide academic assessment (SAT).
 - How parents and, as appropriate, students may provide meaningful input regarding the district's request (includes students in public charter schools who would be included in such assessments).
 - Any effect of such a request on the instructional program in the LEA.
- District surveys, public meetings, parent/teacher conferences

CCRA District Choice

- ESSA requires states to administer the same academic assessments to measure the achievement of all public elementary school and secondary school students in Oklahoma.
- Districts will have the opportunity to choose either the SAT or ACT to meet the accountability requirements for high school ELA and mathematics.

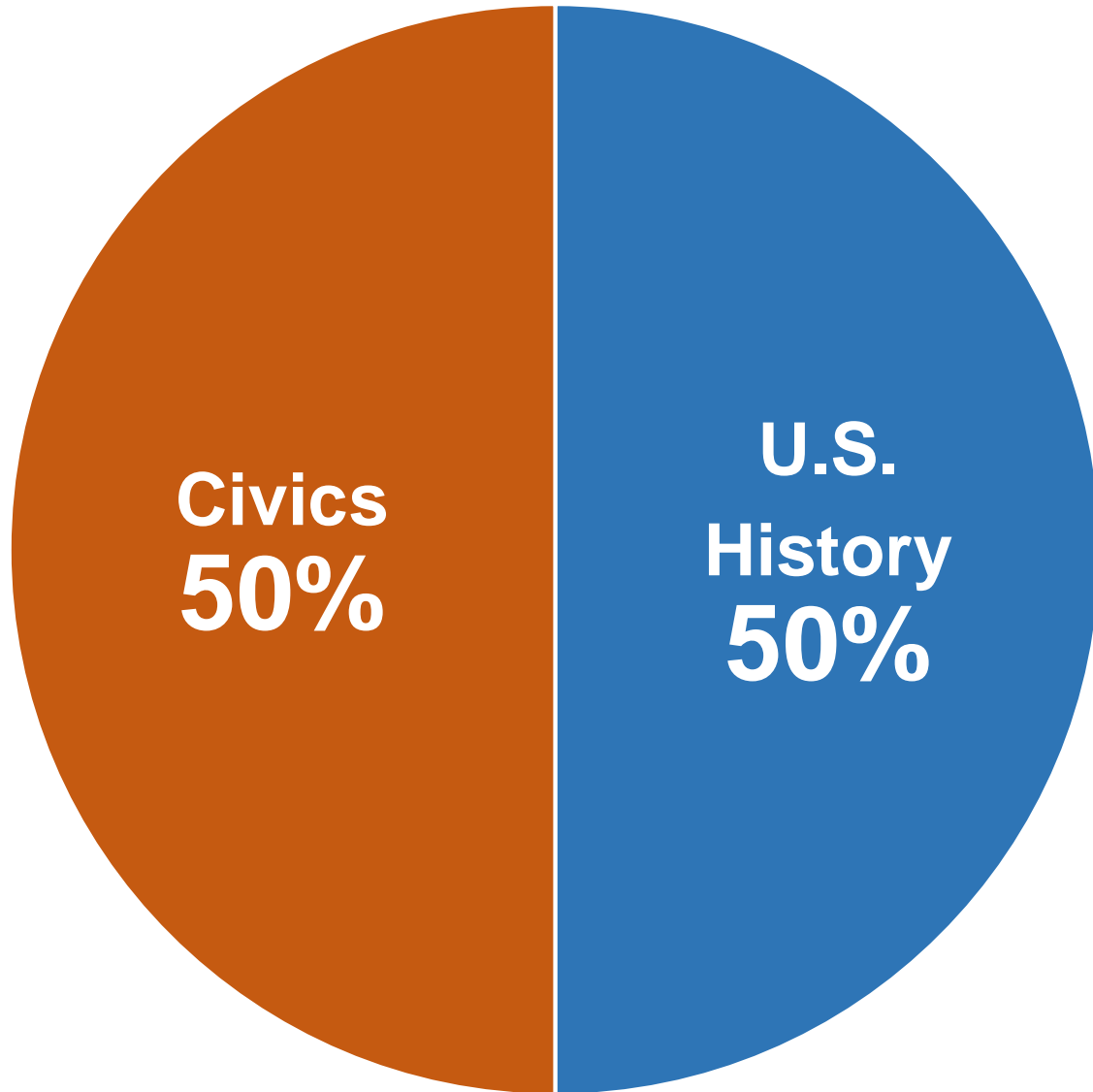
College- and Career-Ready HS Assessments

Testing Calendar 2019-2020

New OSTP Assessment Window

- Assessment window for Grades 3-8 **OPENS** on or after April 20th of every year.
- Window **CLOSES** 20 business days after the window opens.
- Ex. April 20, 2020, through May 15, 2020.

CCRA Assessment Window

- College- and Career-Readiness Assessment (CCRA) dates are negotiated annually with vendors.
- Typically, the assessment dates range from the end of March through April.
- Online CCRA: April 1, 2020 through April 24, 2020.
- Paper CCRA: April 1, 2020 through April 17, 2020.
- ACT & SAT have defined dates.

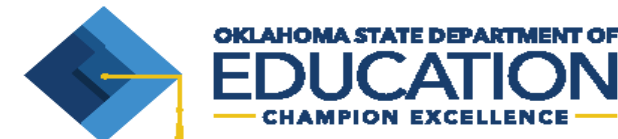

- Students can gain familiarity with the online testing platform and universal tools.

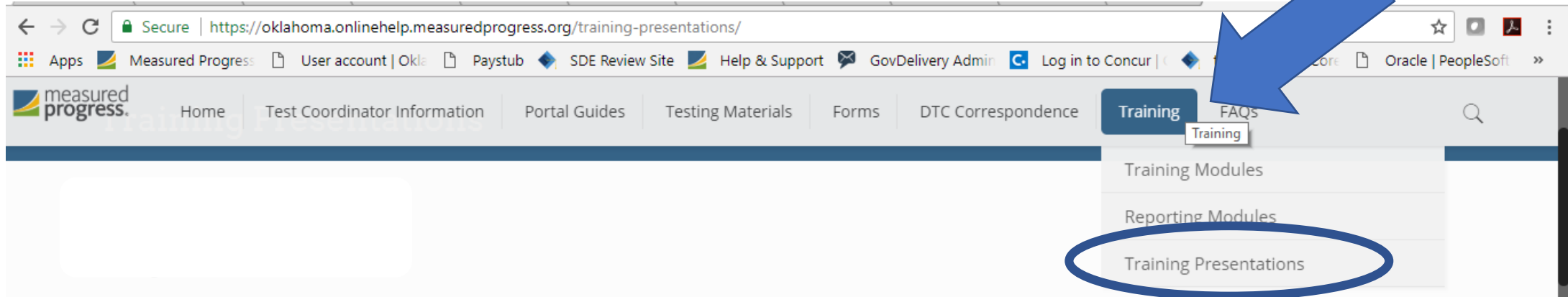
OSTP 3-8 Parent Portal

- The Oklahoma Parent Portal is designed to provide students and parents with online access to a student's state assessment scores.
- It will assist students and parents with tracking assessment information throughout a student's academic career.
- The portal provides scores for the OSTP 2017, 2018, and 2019 assessments.
- Requires Student Testing Number (STN) and Date of Birth to create account.
- Only one account can be created per student.

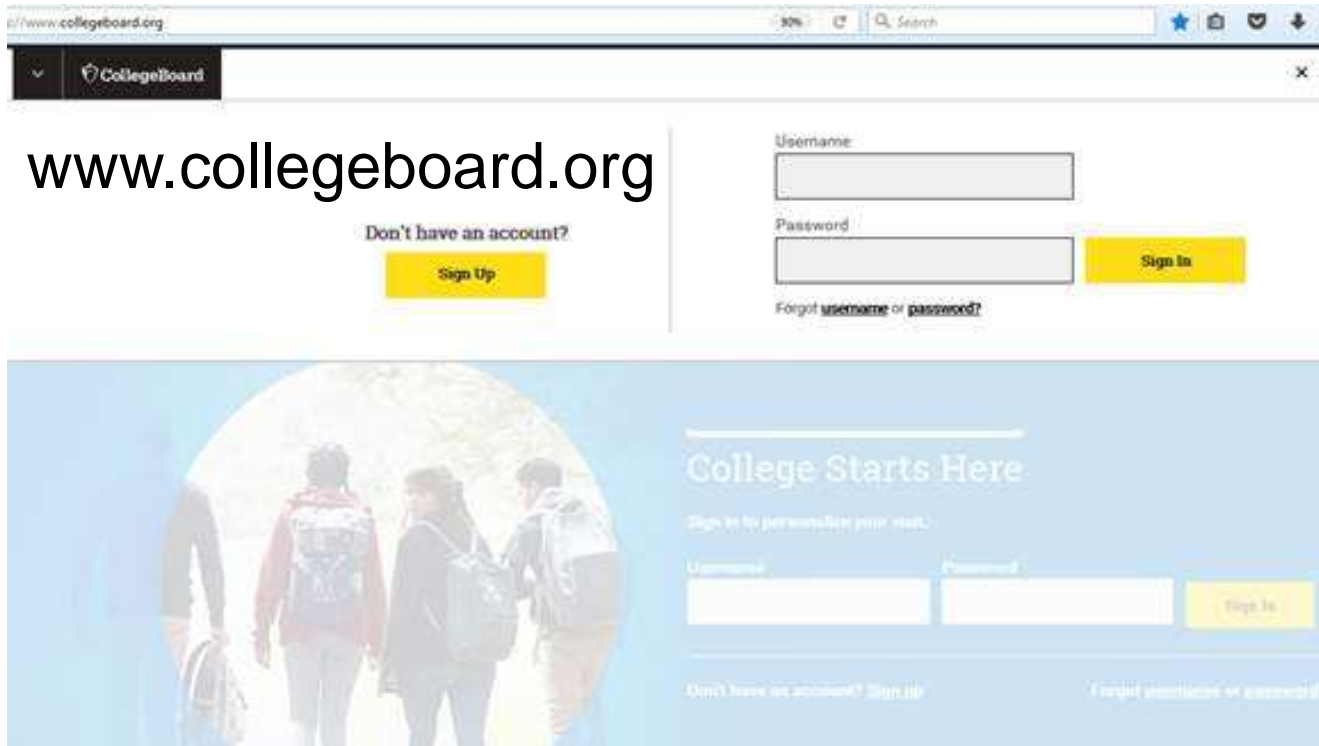

CCRA Science Results

- A standard setting for the Grade 11 CCRA Science assessment was conducted in June 2019 and results will be reported in final reporting.
- Results will be available via the Measured Progress portal at the end of July 2019.
- Participation and achievement will be included in accountability calculations.

Graduation & Transcripts 2019 & 2020

Assessment Graduation Guidance for Classes 2019 & 2020

Student(s) must satisfy the local school district's policy or requirements on graduation as they relate to state assessment(s).

- For purposes of complying with state and federal law, annually local school districts must administer the state/federally required assessments *to all students*, and measure the achievement of not less than 95% of all students and each subgroup of students.

See 70 O.S. §Section 1210.508 (E)-(F)



Assessment Graduation Guidance for Classes 2019 & 2020

District policy will determine assessment graduation requirements for students enrolled as an 11th grader who did not participate in one or more of the Grade 11 CCRA assessments.

Assessment Graduation Guidance for Classes 2019 & 2020

There may be cases where a student, including an alternative education student, is promoted in such a way that he/she is never enrolled in the 11th grade. In these cases, districts will be responsible for providing students with an opportunity to participate in the Grade 11 CCRA assessments.



Assessment Graduation Guidance for Class 2020

Seniors who have not taken the U.S. History test will participate in the Grade 11 CCRA U.S. History Content in April.

These students will not be automatically uploaded into the testing portal and must be entered manually.

Assessment Graduation Guidance for Classes 2019 & 2020

At a minimum, schools must transcript Grade 11 OPI scores for:

- ✓ ELA Composite (SAT/ACT);
 - ✓ Math (SAT/ACT);
 - ✓ Science Content (OSTP)*;
 - ✓ U.S. History (OSTP)**; and
 - ✓ Any business/industry endorsements.
- Districts may add additional elements to student transcripts as they see fit.

Assessment Graduation Guidance for Classes 2019 & 2020

- Currently, the OPI scores for SAT/ACT ELA & Math are available in the SDE Single Sign-On in the Accountability Reporting application and will soon be available in MyData on the WAVE.
- The Spring 2019 CCRA Science test was an operational test, and the OPI score must be indicated on the transcript.
- Participation in either the Formative Assessment, US History test on the WAVE, or the legacy US History EOI may be indicated on a student's transcript to meet participation requirements.
